

Missing Persons Searches POSITIVE OUTCOMES

"Two missing 17-year-olds suspected of having been trafficked for the purpose of sexual exploitation were located in a brothel in [city in the north of England] and were referred into the NRM and accommodated by social care.

A few days later they went missing again. I [analyst working with a local police force] was able identify an ad in Traffic Jam that linked to the girls in London. Shortly after, the girls were located in that city and a male suspect was arrested for having facilitated their exploitation."

Silent victims: the hidden Romanian women exploited in the UK sex trade

- "Sex traffickers can make profits of over £1m a year per brothel and Covid lockdowns have only made it easier for them to operate"
- "Decade ago we knew where the brothels and massage parlours were in Greater Manchester. Now everything is done online"
- "During lockdown, outreach services have been cut, GP surgeries are closed, people aren't out on the street seeing addresses where suspicious activities may be occurring," he says.

Safeguarding A VICTIM CENTERED APPROACH

- Placing the crime victim's priorities, needs, and interests at the center of the work with the victim.
- Providing nonjudgmental assistance, with an emphasis on self-determination, and assisting victims in making informed choices.
- Ensuring that restoring victims' feelings of safety and security are a priority and safeguarding against policies and practices that may inadvertently re-traumatize victims.
- In the context of enforcement operations, a victim-centered approach means the enforcement agency places **equally high value** on the identification, assistance, and protection of victims as on the investigation and prosecution of perpetrators.


A victim-centered approach entails a trauma-informed, survivor-informed and culturally competent approach.



Online Sex Work A DEFINITION

Growth in online sex work is a major theme in pandemic and post pandemic landscape. Online Sex Work can be loosely broken into two categories:

- The **first** involves the use of the Internet to actually *deliver* a service. This includes webcam modeling, phone sex, and virtual reality experiences; as well as the selling of photos and videos. Social Media is one of the primary delivery methods.
- The **second** type refers to the use of the Internet to market sexual services that are delivered in physical space. Most commonly, workers in this category use the Internet to facilitate eventual in-person interactions (e.g. by marketing services, screening clients, making appointments, etc.).

- "I want to instill hope," Church says. "I want them to see that there is a way out, and there is the ability that they can reach any goal that they have for themselves. That you don't have to be stuck, that there are people who care."
