

## What is the Challenge?

Health care organizations are adopting coordinated care practices at varying rates:

- 7% said their patients' care was fully coordinated between the various health care settings.
- 30% said care was mostly coordinated.
- 53% said care was somewhat coordinated.
- 10% care was not coordinated.

Gain a comprehensive understanding of youth behavioral and mental health needs in Lancaster County



Encourage a culture of collaboration that fosters community partnerships to meet the behavioral and mental health needs of Lancaster County children, their families and caregivers

## Community Needs Assessment

Conducted secondary data analysis of National-Regional-Local challenges. Completed interviews and focus groups with invested families, community members and stakeholders. Executed a telephone survey with 1,015 Lancaster County parents.


